

Funeral Planning Details to Consider

General Details:

Will there be a casket or cremains?

What funeral home or cremation service will you use?

How many people do you anticipate attending?

Do any of your guests have special needs?

Would you like a reception following the service?

Will the funeral home be assisting with ushering, caring for the family and the coffin (if there is one)?

Concerning the Service:

Will the service include Holy Eucharist? (Service time is approx. 35- 45 min with communion; 20-30 min without communion)

Please Note: It is the custom of this parish not to have eulogies or an "open mic" time during the service in which people voluntarily stand and speak about the deceased. That opportunity is encouraged for the reception following the service.

Please note a photo of your loved one may be displayed in the entryway and on the bulletin cover. Please send a high resolution photo (.jpg or .png file format) to the parish office (office@holycommunion.net).

Readings

The texts below are appointed by the Book of Common Prayer for the Burial Office. If your loved one had a favorite scripture you would prefer to use, please discuss this with the priest. If there is communion, there must be a gospel reading.
