Welcome to The Episcopal Church of the Holy Communion, a welcoming and diverse community seeking to walk in the way of Jesus and to reveal Christ's reconciling love in our city, nation, and world.

Children are especially welcome at Holy Communion, wiggles, noises, and all. There is a soft space at the back of the church, where little ones may play quietly during the service. Our chapel is a good place to bring a crying infant, with windows into the church and speakers broadcasting the sound from the service.

Liturgical Changes During Epiphany

- 1) Green frontal color and matching vestments. The "ordinary time" color most often used during the year, green reminds us that we are in the space between great feasts and fasts, when we focus on the challenges of faith in daily life.
- 2) Enriching Our Worship a collection of supplemental prayers approved by the General Convention of The Episcopal Church. Holy Communion has chosen to use these prayers in ordinary time as our "default mode," because they are more inclusive of diverse perspectives and balance feminine and masculine pronouns for God.

The Nicene Creed

Please stand as we recite a modern translation of the ancient formula for faith.

We believe in one God, the Father, the Almighty, maker of heaven and earth, of all that is, seen and unseen.

We believe in one Lord, Jesus Christ, the only Son of God, eternally begotten of the Father, God from God, Light from Light, true God from true God, begotten, not made, of one Being with the Father; through him all things were made. For us and for our salvation he came down from heaven, was incarnate of the Holy Spirit and the Virgin Mary and became truly human. For our sake he was crucified under Pontius Pilate; he suffered death and was buried. On the third day he rose again in accordance with the Scriptures; he ascended into heaven and is seated at the right hand of the Father. He will come again in glory to judge the living and the dead, and his kingdom will have no end.

We believe in the Holy Spirit, the Lord, the giver of life, who proceeds from the Father, who with the Father and the Son is worshiped and glorified, who has spoken through the prophets We believe in one holy catholic and apostolic Church. We acknowledge one baptism for the forgiveness of sins. We look for the resurrection of the dead, and the life of the world to come. Amen.
